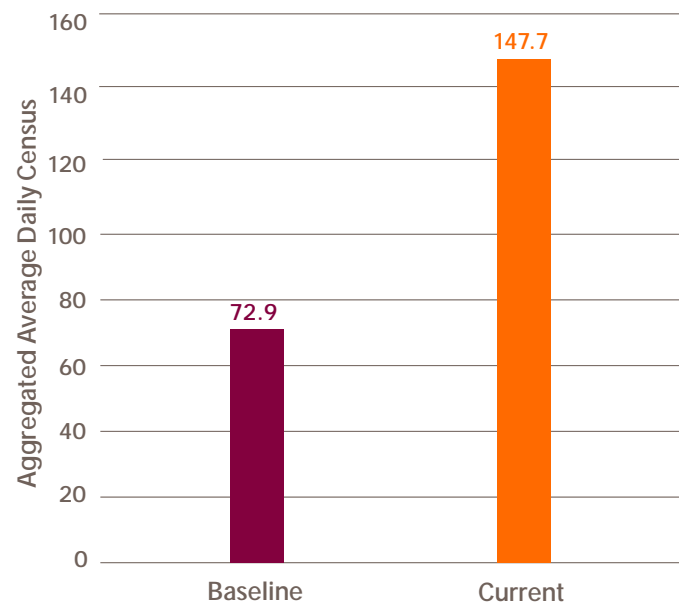

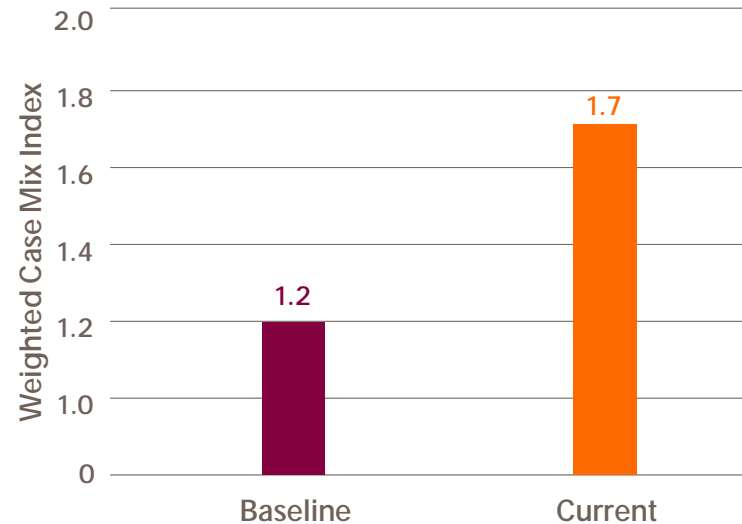

While Serving More Complex Patients



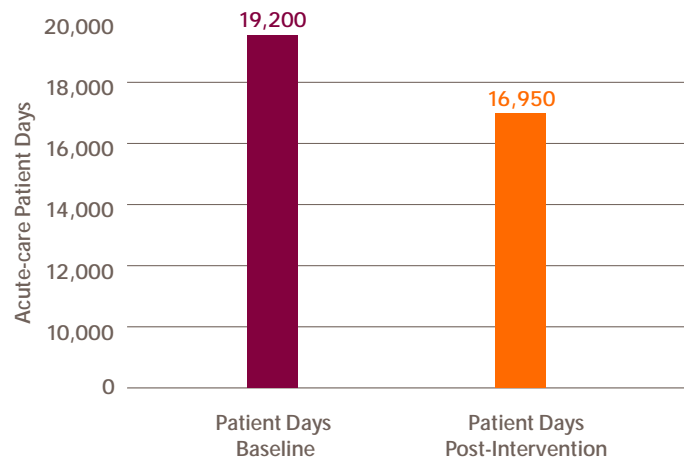
Case Mix Index (CMI) is used in inpatient rehabilitation facilities to measure the acuity of the patient population. Higher numbers indicate increased average acuity of the patient population. Note that CMI calculations and weight factors for rehabilitation facilities differ from acute-care facilities.

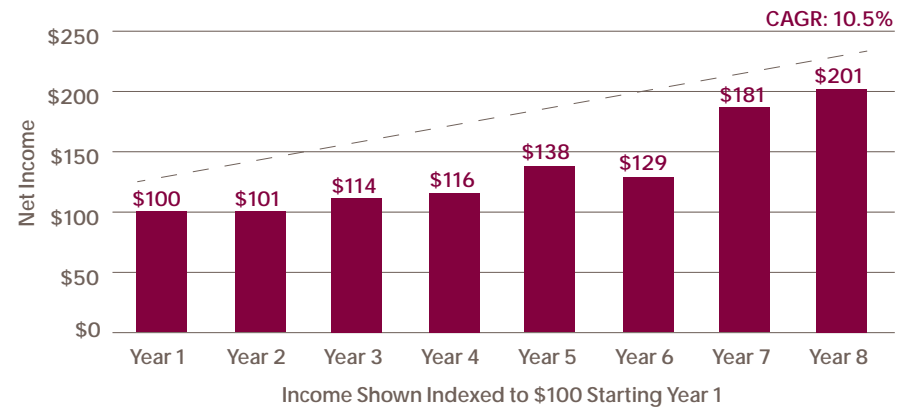

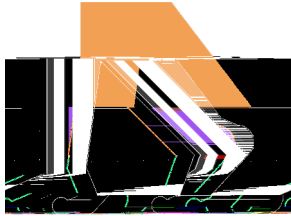
